Here at Ranchero Elementary, *Critical Thinking* has been one of the Core Competencies of the new curriculum that we have been learning and practicing. Critical thinking, or the need to think deeper and differently about a subject, are important qualities to instill in children to help them navigate through their learning and their lives. Critical thinking skills will help students learn to interpret and understand information, rather than simply memorizing it.

The three phases of critical thinking are:

- Analyze reflect on and evaluate thinking, products and actions
- Question explore materials and actions
- Develop design and experiment with different ways of doing things

Two years ago we launched a project that was so much fun we are doing it again but this time with a twist. Today, we launched a school project called **Ranchero's Most Magnificent Thing COMPASSION Project**. Students will be designing 'magnificent things' out of the empty boxes they have brought, practicing the stages of critical thinking along the way. **This time their magnificent things will be designed to help someone, a group of people, an animal, the environment, or a global issue of some sort. They need to think "out of the box"!**
